Audit of the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report of the Fire and Police Employees' Retirement System Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2012.

President: "The first item on the non-routine agenda can be found on Page 11, the Department of Audits, Audit Report and the related Audit Digest. Will the parties please come forward?" Robert McCarty, City Auditor: "Good morning Mr. President, Members of the Board. I'm Bob McCarty. I'm the City Auditor. The Department of Audits has completed its annual review of the financial statements of the Fire and Police Retirement System for the fiscal year ended June 30--30, 2012. We have issued an unqualified opinion, which states that their financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the System, for the year ended June 2012, in conformity with generally accepted accounting 30, principles. The System's net assets totaled \$2,140,000,000.00 at year-end, an increase in net assets of \$2,000,000.00 from fiscal year 2011. For fiscal year 2012, payments to its 6,136 retirees beneficiaries totaled \$204,300,000.00. and The City's contribution to the System totaled \$107,500,000.00. That's a

decrease of \$51,000.00 from the previous fiscal year. addition to the report, we have included a separate report required by both generally accepted auditing standards and Government Auditing Standards that addresses the compliance with certain laws and regulations, and the internal control over financial reporting relating to the financial sys-statements. Based on our audit, the results of our tests disclosed no instances of non-compliance with or regulations, and there were no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in internal control over financial reporting during the financial statements during fiscal year 2012. The System did have one significant deficiency in fiscal year 2011. found then, that pension benefits were paid to We surviving children of retirees, which totaled \$43,980.00. Those benefits should have been suspended for the surviving children due to the lack of proper documentation to prove their enrollment as a full time student. We recommended that the System implement procedures to timely suspend these benefits until the required proof of enrollment is submitted. recommendation was implemented by the System during fiscal year 2012. We reported that one student repaid \$18,976.00

leaving \$25,004.00 in outstanding overpayments due from the two other students. We recommended that the System recover the remaining \$25,004.00 in overpayments. Additional information was provided by the System which documented that the overpayment amount outstanding should have actually been \$22,888.00. As stated in the System's procedures for overpayments, the \$22,888.00 in overpayments for the two students has been submitted to the Law Department for recovery. We therefore consider this fiscal year 2011 significant deficiency to be resolved."

Bradford Carney: "For the record my name is Bradford Carney and I represent Spiniello Companies, with respect to the contract number SC 931, which is before this body for consideration and award. Ah--Anchor Construction Company was in fact the lowest bidder when the bids were opened and we filed a protest as a consequence of uh-- what we believe to be very serious and material omissions from the attachments to the bid filed by Anchor. Anchor Construction Company started off its existence in 1985 in Washington, DC. It was known as C&F Construction Company, Incorporated." In 19--or 2000, June 13, specifically of 2000 Anchor, C&F Construction and its president, Florentino Gregorio were indicted by the Federal Government in U.S. District Court in Washington, DC. They were charged with bribery, conspiracy, money laundering, and other major league

felonies. Ah--after about a year of litigation, Mr. Gregorio and the company pled guilty to--ah--C&F plead guilty to bribery of a public official and Mr. Gregorio pled guilty to bribery, and unlawful supplementation of a government employee's income. They were debarred from doing business with Washington, DC. for a three-year period of time. They were placed on probation. At the end of that--"

City Solicitor: "I'm sorry. That was in 2001?"

Bradford Carney: "Starting in 2000."

City Solicitor: "2000?"

Bradford Carney: "So, now we're into 2003. At the end of the probationary period, Mr. Gregorio changed the name of his company to Anchor Construction, the company who has submitted the bid that you are considering today. When they submitted their bid for this particular contract, SC 931, they failed to disclose their criminal history um -- which I believe was a material omission. Ah--admittedly, they have disclosed in prior submissions their criminal activity that they have been involved in historically. Ah, they--for whatever reason, umm, in this bid and for the past couple years, they have failed to disclose that criminal history. Ah -- I think that--that omission

obviously, is material. This Board needs to know the background of its contractors and especially when has involved activity such as bribery of a public official, money laundering, and the entry of guilty pleas. There are two other relatively minor component parts to the bid protest and that has to do with the status of the contractors listed as either MBE WBE subcontractors that Anchor says it intends to use. Specifically, R.E. Harrington Plumbing & Heating Company, there is specification in the bid as to whether or not they are an MBE contractor or WBE contractor as is required by your own rules. There is no live signature on that submission. It is a automatic pen type of a signature which is obviously violative of your own rules as well. With respect to the other contractor listed, T.F.E. Resources, Limited, ah -- they are supposedly going to provide CCTV and cleaning services but they are not certified to provide any cleaning services even though that's what they are supposedly going to be providing Anchor as a subcontractor and a minority contractor. That is the substance of our protest. Thank you."

When Anchor first approached the City of Baltimore to obtain prequalification, it made full disclosure of past history, provided all the details to the City of Baltimore, and in fact in every R-- every proposal it has submitted, including the proposal at issue here, it provided written disclosure to the City of Baltimore. Um, at--there was a, ah what I believe counsel is referring to, and has misrepresented, is there was an error -- clerical error is the prequalification renewal documents that were submitted. That has been corrected."

<u>City Solicitor:</u> "Those-- I'm sorry, those were the documents submitted in 2012, the most recent round of precertification?"

Carolyn O'Riordan: "Yes sir. That is correct."

City Solicitor: "Okay, thanks."

He is now the national ah-- chair of National Utilities Contractors Association, as well as a founding member of NUCA in DC. Ah--the company supports the community here in Baltimore and in all of the areas in which it operates.

<u>City Solicitor:</u> "Just ah ah -- a quick question. Ah--there's been reference relating to a period of debarment in DC. I think there also may have been a period of debarment or two in-- in Maryland jurisdictions. Are any of those other debarments still alive and in effect to your knowledge?

Carolyn O'Riordan: "No sir. There were— there were a variety of things in place. There were debarments. There were restrictions and reporting periods. All have sunsetted on their own. Um and um— the company has been doing significant amounts of work in all jurisdictions. Um—and we provided all of the information with respect to that, to the City, in connection with this, and in fact the company was prequalified— its prequalification was renewed on January 9, of this year—"

City Solicitor: "Good."

Carolyn O'Riordan: "in response to that. With respect to the other points that were raised, again, counsel is incorrect when he states that the proposal submitted by Anchor failed to identify its subcontractor as an MBE. That contractor was indeed identified in the proposal documents as an MBE and counsel is also incorrect when he states that the second subcontractor, T.F.E., is not certified for the work that it is proposed to perform. It is indeed certified for that work. The cleaning of pipes is a necessary and ancillary action with respect to the—to the ah— specifically certified activity for television. In order to introduce the equipment into the pipes you have to

clean them first and that's part of what this contractor does every day. So again, with--with--with due respect to counsel, I would urge that the award be approved to -- to Anchor, which has proven itself to be a valuable and ah-- and-- and-- ah partner in wet infrastructure and utilities construction elsewhere.

City Solicitor: "Mr. Corey."

Thomas Corey: "Mr. President--"

Carolyn O'Riordan: "I'm sorry, if I may one moment. The signature— I apologize. The ah— signature block is consistent with every signature that has been submitted by Mr. Harrington on all of his contracts and all of his proposals, both as a subcontractor and as a prime contractor with the City of Baltimore, and counsel has not referenced anything that said—that—that the council's prior approval of Mr. Harrington's use of an automatic signature is in appropriate."

Thomas Corey: "Mr. President, and members of the Board, Thomas Corey, Chief of Minority Women's Business Opportunity Office.

Ah--in reference to the ah-- protestant's, um-- concerns about T.F.E. Resources ah-- the cleaning services that would be performed on this contract is incidental to the CCTV ah-- service that um-- going to be provided.

You have to provide, as Ms. O'Riordan said, you have to clean the pipes before you can introduce your equipment in there, so we find that's-- that perfectly acceptable for MWBOO ah-approval. Ah-- as far as R.E. Harrington's signature, we do not look to find if it's-- if the signature's by autopen, by hand, or by a stamp. If it's representative of the signature, and it looks like a signature, and that's what the ah-- the--the-contractor is presenting as his signature, we accept it as-- as good. Um-- and but that's-- that's it. I mean they meet all of their approvals. I think that addresses both of the concerns with the MWE and WBE."

City Solicitor: "Mr. Schrock, anything to add for the Law Department? And you do need to get close to the microphone."

Michael Schrock: "Mike Schrock for the Law Department.

Regarding the issue on the omission on the conviction, um, actually the Office of Boards and Commissions had already looked at this issue, and the Law Department. It was before you at the Board of Estimates on January 9th, when the prequalification. No information that I know of was any different, since January 9th

and the Office of Boards and Commission um-- said that it was okay to go forward with prequalification of Anchor and furthermore, you as the Board of Estimates also approved that at that time. I don't think there's any new information since January 9th to supplement what's that at that time. So, as far as the Law Department's concerned, we feel the ah -- candidate does -- should be awarded the contract, and is responsible. Thank you."

Thomas Corey: "Mr. President one-- I did forget one -- issue.

The ah-- umm-- it was mentioned that there's umm-- R.E.

Harrington was not identified as an MBE on their documents.

That's not true. They are identified. We were able to determine this right on the document page. They circled them as an MBE on their statement of intent form."

President: "Okay. Any um -- you have to talk--"

City Solicitor: "You have to talk into the microphone sir."

Bradford Carney: "In response, ah -- respectfully to counsel's ah-- statements that we have not been forthcoming with this Board, that is simply not the case. No one here has ever intent -- intentionally tried to mislead this Board other than Anchor Construction Company. It is Anchor Construction Company that

failed to list its criminal past on the current bid. I don't think anybody can deny that fact. Counsel certainly has not denied that fact. Because they may have done so in the past, that's fine, but each contract has to stand and fall on its own merits and each contract has its own set of requirements. And one of the requirements is to disclose this type of activity, if in fact it's in your past to disclose, and it's not been done. So, I leave it to this Board to determine whether or not the City wants to do business with someone who, as counsel has said, plays fast and loose with the truth. It's not Spiniello. It's Anchor."

President: "Okay, I'll entertain a motion."

<u>City Solicitor:</u> "I move to deny the bid protest, and award the contract consistent with the agency's recommendation, umm-- in considering all of the issues raised both the umm-- disclosure, the prior criminal history, as well as the MWBOO issues.

Comptroller: "Second."

President: "All those in favor say Aye."

City Solicitor: "Aye."

Director of Public Works: "Aye."

<u>President:</u> "All apposed, "Nay". Please note that I **ABSTAINED**.

The Motion carries.

Factual History:

On September 19, 2012, the Baltimore City Board of Estimates (the "Board") opened the bids for Contract Number SC 931 – Rehabilitation and Improvements to Sanitary Sewers at Various Locations in Baltimore City (the "Contract"). Between two bidders, Anchor Construction Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "Anchor") submitted the lowest bid for this project. As of the date of filing this Supplemental Bid Protest, the Contract has not been placed on the Board's Agenda to be awarded.

On October 5, 2012, Spiniello Companies (hereinafter referred to as "Spiniello") filed their original bid protest; the contents thereof are incorporated by reference as if fully restated. Spiniello herein supplements their original bid protest based upon the receipt of new information that is highly relevant to this matter.

Statement of Law:

Only contractors that are awarded Certificates of Prequalification by the Baltimore City Board of Estimates are permitted to bid on contracts with the City. "A Prequalification Certificate insures the City that a firm is qualified in their profession to do the contracted work." Upon proper submission, bids are subject to Article VI § 11(h)(1)(ii) of the Baltimore City Charter (the "Charter"), which states "the Board of Estimates shall award the contract, as an entirety to the lowest <u>responsive and responsible bidder</u> or by items to the respective lowest <u>responsive and responsible bidders</u>, or shall reject all bids..." (emphasis added). Accordingly, the Board of Estimates shall only award a contract to the lowest responsive and responsible prequalified bidder.

A responsible bidder is "...[o]ne who is not only financially responsible, but who is possessed of a judgment, skill, ability, capacity and integrity requisite and necessary to perform a public contract according to its terms." While neither the Charter nor the Baltimore City Code ("City Code") specifically define the term "responsible," the procurement contract provisions of the State Code provide that a bidder may be found to be not responsible for "...any other reason indicating that the person does not have... the integrity and reliability that will ensure good faith performance." Additionally, the Code of Maryland Regulations ("COMAR") provides identical language to the State Code. Such provisions are consistent with the legal definition of the term "responsible bidder."

The term "integrity" is defined as "...soundness of moral principle and character, as shown by one person dealing with others in the making and performance of contracts, and

fidelity and honesty in the discharge of trusts; it is synonymous with 'probity,' 'honesty,' and 'uprightness.'6 Likewise, the term "reliable" is defined as "[t]rustworthy, worthy of confidence." Thus, the Board shall only award contracts to those pregualified bidders that exhibit moral soundness, probity, honesty, and trustworthiness.

Supplemental Bid Protest:

Overview of Supplemental Protest:

Anchor Construction and its President, Florentino Gregorio, by their own admission have been involved in criminal activity directly stemming from their business as a government contractor. As stated in Spiniello's original bid protest, the criminal history of Mr. Gregorio and Anchor, as well as the nature of their criminal offenses, raised questions as to the appropriateness of Anchor's status as a prequalified contractor. Accordingly, Spiniello submitted a Freedom of Information Act request to obtain Anchor's Prequalification Applications from Baltimore City. Upon review of the responsive documents produced by the City of Baltimore, it is abundantly clear that Anchor submitted false information and Mr. Gregorio lied under oath in their Prequalification Applications.

For the above stated reasons, Anchor should have its pregualification status revoked, the company should be disqualified from consideration for the Contract at issue and at the very least, Anchor should not be deemed to be a "responsible bidder" under Article VI § 11 of the Baltimore City Charter, its bid package should be deemed unresponsive and rejected, and the next lowest responsible bidder should be awarded the Contract.

Anchor Construction Corporate History/Criminal Charges:

Anchor Construction was founded in 1985 and operated under the name C & F Construction Company until 2005.8 On June 13, 2000, while still operating as C & F Construction Company, Florentino Gregorio, Anchor's current President and the then President of C & F Construction, and C & F Construction were indicted on charges of bribery, conspiracy, money laundering and fraud by the Federal Government in the U S. District Court for the District of Columbia.9 These criminal charges were the result of an extensive investigation conducted by the Office of the Inspector General and the FBI.10 The investigation revealed that C & F Construction and Mr. Gregorio had instituted multiple schemes to defraud the District of Columbia under a Federal Highway Administration paving contract the company had been awarded.

The criminal cases against Mr. Gregorio and C & F Construction continued for over a year and a half and only concluded after a plea deal was accepted. Mr. Gregorio pleaded guilty to bribery; unlawful supplementation of a government employee's income¹¹ and C & F Construction pleaded guilty to bribery of a public official; payment of a gratuity. Mr. Gregorio was required to complete one year of probation, 300 hours of community service, pay a special assessment of \$25.00 and pay restitution of \$41,000. C & F Construction was required to complete one year of probation, pay a special assessment of \$400 and ordered to pay restitution of \$41,000.

Anchor's Status as a Pre-Qualified Contractor:

This Protestant filed a Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") Request for all applications and records associated with the prequalification of Anchor (or any of its iterations), as well as Florentino Gregorio. Upon review of the public records produced, it is clear that Anchor submitted false affidavits and information to the Board in their Prequalification Application. 16

In two separate Prequalification Applications, Mr. Gregorio, on behalf of Anchor, signed Affidavits for Qualification dated October 20, 2011 and September 28, 2012, respectively. In the Affidavits for Qualification, Mr. Gregorio swore under oath that "to the best of my knowledge and belief neither [Anchor] nor any of its officers [...] involved in obtaining its contracts with the State of Maryland [...] has ever been convicted of any crime of bribery [...]. As detailed at length above, Mr. Gregorio pleaded guilty to bribery; unlawful supplementation of a government employee's income and Anchor (formerly known as C & F Construction) pleaded guilty to bribery of a public official; payment of a gratuity. Accordingly, Mr. Gregorio committed perjury by submitting these Affidavits of Qualification after both he and Anchor had pleaded guilty to bribery. The fact that Mr. Gregorio submitted two separate perjurious affidavits demonstrates that he and Anchor are continuing the same type of deceitful and corrupt behavior that resulted in their June 13, 2000 criminal indictments.

Anchor included a statement labeled as Attachment A with their bid submission which purports to be a full disclosure about their criminal past.²¹ Attachment A also attempts to

appease any concerns about Anchor's criminal history by detailing procedural safeguards that have since been implemented by the company and claiming that "honesty and integrity" are a top priority. However, Anchor's submission of false affidavits demonstrates that "honesty and integrity" are <u>not</u> a priority for this company. Anchor's failure to acknowledge their criminal past in their Prequalification Application shows that they are also not abiding by the procedural safeguards detailed by them in Attachment A, as shown by following excerpt:

"From the day of the indictment on June 13, 2000 until the present date, Anchor Construction Corporation, formally known as C&F has included a statement similar to this attachment responding to any bid question regarding indictments, plea agreements, convictions, suspension or debarment."²²

Despite this representation, clearly the false Affidavits of Qualification submitted to the Board show that Anchor has been anything but forthright about their and Mr. Gregorio's criminal pasts in the prequalification process. Anchor's deception in their Prequalification Applications is significant because "a Prequalification Certificate insures the City that a firm is qualified in their profession to do the contracted work" and "possession of a valid Certificate of Prequalification is deemed proof of qualification." These general rules coupled with Anchor's statement in Attachment A claiming that they always disclose their criminal past, creates a presumption that the Board deemed them to be a qualified contractor despite their criminal past, which is not true. There is no indication that the Board was even aware of Anchor's criminal past when they awarded Anchor a Certificate of Prequalification.

Additionally, in both of Anchor's Prequalification Applications they misrepresented that they have operated under their current business name for over 26 years. Anchor Construction was founded as C & F Construction Company in 1985 in the District of Columbia. On February 1, 2005, C & F Construction Company changed its name to Anchor Construction Corporation. It could be no coincidence that immediately upon the conclusion of the debarment, exclusion and suspension terms that resulted from their criminal proceedings, C & F Construction Company changed its name to Anchor Construction Corporation. The argument that the Board was not aware of Anchor's criminal history when they awarded Anchor a Certificate of Prequalification is only strengthened by the fact that in their Prequalification Application Anchor did not acknowledge that they had operated under the name C & F Construction for over 20 years and that while they operated under that name the company and its president pleaded guilty to bribery.

The City of Baltimore Rules for Qualifications of Contractors, as approved by the Board of Estimates on October 30, 1991, provide at Section 5.1.2(1) that among the acts that shall be considered grounds for revocation of a Prequalification Certificate or suspension thereof are "Submission of falsified or inaccurate [...] data upon which qualification is based." Anchor's conduct and the behavior of its principals are grounds for disqualification of the business as a contractor to the City of Baltimore. Continuing to list Anchor as a Pre-Qualified Contractor is not in the best interest of the City and its citizens.

Conclusion:

For the above stated reasons, the Board should revoke Anchor Construction Company's Prequalification Certificate, they should not be deemed a "responsible bidder", its bid

submission should be found to be non-responsive, and Anchor should not be awarded Contract SC 931.

Summary

C&F Construction Company, Landover, MD, and its President, Florentino Gregorio, were sentenced in U.S. District Court in Washington, D.C., after pleading guilty to bribery charges in multiple schemes to defraud the District of Columbia under a FHWA-funded highway paving contract. In a deal with C&F, a District of Columbia public works inspector who oversaw C&F's work inflated the highway contract by more than \$70,000 by falsifying paperwork and accepting false paperwork from C&F for concrete that was never laid. Another scheme involved C&F's purchasing more than \$10,000 worth of landscaping equipment for the inspector's side business and then receiving a kickback for the sum from the inflated job costs. The judge ordered Gregorio to pay \$41,000 in restitution and placed the company on probation for 1 year. Gregorio and C&F pleaded guilty on December 7, 2001. This investigation was conducted by OIG and the FBI.

→→ § 209. Salary of Government officials and employees payable only by United States

(a) Whoever receives any salary, or any contribution to or supplementation of salary, as compensation for his services as an officer or employee of the executive branch of the United States Government, of any independent agency of the United States, or of the District of Columbia, from any source other than the Government of the United States, except as may be contributed out of the treasury of any State, county, or municipality; or

Whoever, whether an individual, partnership, association, corporation, or other organization pays, makes any contribution to, or in any way supplements, the salary of any such officer or employee under circumstances which would make its receipt a violation of this subsection--

Shall be subject to the penalties set forth in section 216 of this title.

- (b) Nothing herein prevents an officer or employee of the executive branch of the United States Government, or of any independent agency of the United States, or of the District of Columbia, from continuing to participate in a bona fide pension, retirement, group life, health or accident insurance, profit-sharing, stock bonus, or other employee welfare or benefit plan maintained by a former employer.
- (c) This section does not apply to a special Government employee or to an officer or employee of the Government serving without compensation, whether or not he is a special Government employee, or to any person paying, contributing to, or supplementing his salary as such.
- (d) This section does not prohibit payment or acceptance of contributions, awards, or other expenses under the terms of chapter 41 of title 5.
- (e) This section does not prohibit the payment of actual relocation expenses incident to participation, or the acceptance of same by a participant in an executive exchange or fellowship program in an executive agency: Provided, That such program has been established by statute or Executive

order of the President, offers appointments not to exceed three hundred and sixty-five days, and permits no extensions in excess of ninety additional days or, in the case of participants in overseas assignments, in excess of three hundred and sixty-five days.

- (f) This section does not prohibit acceptance or receipt, by any officer or employee injured during the commission of an offense described in <u>section 351</u> or <u>1751</u> of this title, of contributions or payments from an organization which is described in <u>section 501(c)</u> (3) of the Internal Revenue <u>Code of 1986</u> and which is exempt from taxation under section 501(a) of such Code.
- (g)(1) This section does not prohibit an employee of a private sector organization, while assigned to an agency under chapter 37 of title 5, from continuing to receive pay and benefits from such organization in accordance with such chapter.
- (2) For purposes of this subsection, the term "agency" means an agency (as defined by section 3701 of title 5) and the Office of the Chief Technology Officer of the District of Columbia.
- (h) This section does not prohibit a member of the reserve components of the armed forces on active duty pursuant to a call or order to active duty under a provision of law referred to in section 101(a)(13) of title 10 from receiving from any person that employed such member before the call or order to active duty any payment of any part of the salary or wages that such person would have paid the member if the member's employment had not been interrupted by such call or order to active duty.

→→ § 201. Bribery of public officials and witnesses

- (a) For the purpose of this section--
 - (1) the term "public official" means Member of Congress, Delegate, or Resident Commissioner, either before or after such official has qualified, or an officer or employee or person acting for or on behalf of the United States, or any department, agency or branch of Government thereof, including the District of Columbia, in any official function, under or by authority of any such department, agency, or branch of Government, or a juror;
 - (2) the term "person who has been selected to be a public official" means any person who has been nominated or appointed to be a public official, or has been officially informed that such person will be so nominated or appointed; and
 - (3) the term "official act" means any decision or action on any question, matter, cause, suit, proceeding or controversy, which may at any time be pending, or which may by law be brought before any public official, in such official's official capacity, or in such official's place of trust or profit.

(b) Whoever--

- (1) directly or indirectly, corruptly gives, offers or promises anything of value to any public official or person who has been selected to be a public official, or offers or promises any public official or any person who has been selected to be a public official to give anything of value to any other person or entity, with intent--
 - (A) to influence any official act; or
 - (B) to influence such public official or person who has been selected to be a public official to commit or aid in committing, or collude in, or allow, any fraud, or make opportunity for the commission of any fraud, on the United States; or

- (C) to induce such public official or such person who has been selected to be a public official to do or omit to do any act in violation of the lawful duty of such official or person;
- (2) being a public official or person selected to be a public official, directly or indirectly, corruptly demands, seeks, receives, accepts, or agrees to receive or accept anything of value personally or for any other person or entity, in return for:
 - (A) being influenced in the performance of any official act;
 - (B) being influenced to commit or aid in committing, or to collude in, or allow, any fraud, or make opportunity for the commission of any fraud, on the United States; or
 - (C) being induced to do or omit to do any act in violation of the official duty of such official or person;
- (3) directly or indirectly, corruptly gives, offers, or promises anything of value to any person, or offers or promises such person to give anything of value to any other person or entity, with intent to influence the testimony under oath or affirmation of such first-mentioned person as a witness upon a trial, hearing, or other proceeding, before any court, any committee of either House or both Houses of Congress, or any agency, commission, or officer authorized by the laws of the United States to hear evidence or take testimony, or with intent to influence such person to absent himself therefrom;
- (4) directly or indirectly, corruptly demands, seeks, receives, accepts, or agrees to receive or accept anything of value personally or for any other person or entity in return for being influenced in testimony under oath or affirmation as a witness upon any such trial, hearing, or other proceeding, or in return for absenting himself therefrom;

shall be fined under this title or not more than three times the monetary equivalent of the thing of value, whichever is greater, or imprisoned for not more than fifteen years, or both, and may be disqualified from holding any office of honor, trust, or profit under the United States.

- (c) Whoever--
 - _ (1) otherwise than as provided by law for the proper discharge of official duty--
 - (A) directly or indirectly gives, offers, or promises anything of value to any public official, former public official, or person selected to be a public official, for or because of any official act performed or to be performed by such public official, former public official, or person selected to be a public official; or
 - (B) being a public official, former public official, or person selected to be a public official,

otherwise than as provided by law for the proper discharge of official duty, directly or indirectly demands, seeks, receives, accepts, or agrees to receive or accept anything of value personally for or because of any official act performed or to be performed by such official or person;

- (2) directly or indirectly, gives, offers, or promises anything of value to any person, for or because of the testimony under oath or affirmation given or to be given by such person as a witness upon a trial, hearing, or other proceeding, before any court, any committee of either House or both Houses of Congress, or any agency, commission, or officer authorized by the laws of the United States to hear evidence or take testimony, or for or because of such person's absence therefrom;
- (3) directly or indirectly, demands, seeks, receives, accepts, or agrees to receive or accept anything of value personally for or because of the testimony under oath or affirmation given or to be given by such person as a witness upon any such trial, hearing, or other proceeding, or for or because of such person's absence therefrom;

shall be fined under this title or imprisoned for not more than two years, or both.

- (d) Paragraphs (3) and (4) of subsection (b) and paragraphs (2) and (3) of subsection (c) shall not be construed to prohibit the payment or receipt of witness fees provided by law, or the payment, by the party upon whose behalf a witness is called and receipt by a witness, of the reasonable cost of travel and subsistence incurred and the reasonable value of time lost in attendance at any such trial, hearing, or proceeding, or in the case of expert witnesses, a reasonable fee for time spent in the preparation of such opinion, and in appearing and testifying.
- (e) The offenses and penalties prescribed in this section are separate from and in addition to those prescribed in sections 1503, 1504, and 1505 of this title.



BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

Mount Vernon Mill is the historic renovation/restoration of a long vacant, classic industrial mill and warehouse as well as a non-historic warehouse into a multi-purpose development, including affordable housing, office space, restaurant, and new parking. Using a combination of Federal Historic Tax Credits, New Market Tax Credits and other sources, the development team has redeveloped this approximately 230,000 square-foot structure into two complementary parts:

- 1) 51,000 square feet of affordable 'flex' office space for non-profit organizations, and
- 2) 92 one, two, and three bedroom residential units.

As required by the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance and as a result of a Planned Unit Development approval granted to the project in October 21, 2010, the project (the affordable units) will offer five units at rental rates affordable to households earning less than 70% of the Area Median Income (AMI).

The affordable units will include three 1-bedroom units and two 2-bedroon units. This number of units is 50% less than the amount required by the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance, which would otherwise have required ten total units to be made inclusionary. The reason for this reduction is that the Inclusionary Housing Fund was unable to provide the full amount of offset required by the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance and so, as it intends, the Project was subject to a lower requirement. The units are being made available to tenants at less than 70% of AMI with a preference to tenants with Tenant-based Housing Choice Vouchers.

The City has awarded a grant (the City grant) to the Borrower in an amount not-to-exceed \$450,000.00 from the City Inclusionary Housing Fund.

The Borrower will be the Master Tenant of Mount Vernon Mill (the project) an historic rehabilitation of a vacant mill property located at 3000 Falls Road. Proceeds of the City grant will be used to provide financial offset to the Borrower for the execution of a Declaration of Restrictive Covenants and the Regulatory Agreement (the Covenants). The Covenants require the Borrower to meet the requirements of the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance for five housing units and the City grant provides the offset required by the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance.

MBE/WBE PARTICIPATION:

The Departments of Finance and Human Resources request the establishment of a new "holding" classification and salary grade that will support the creation of new positions during the budget process. Historically, creating positions in the budget process allows agencies to circumvent the Department of Human Resources' (DHR) normal review process, which requires new positions to be reviewed for the correct classification, grade, salary, etc. In order to avoid this circumvention, Department of Finance's Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR) has advised agencies that seek to create a new position to use a category called "Pending Personnel Actions". Once funding for the position is approved, the agency then seeks formal review from DHR and then final approval from the Expenditure Control Committee (ECC) and the Board of Estimates (BOE). As a result, the position "counts" in the budget are misleading, since only funding is established in the budget and not an actual position. The position is not calculated when BBMR publishes fiscal year comparisons of authorized positions in the Agency Detail budget publication. The BBMR has received feedback from the City Council in the last two fiscal years that this practice is confusing and misleading.

This proposal would allow the BBMR to create positions in the budget with a new job number, the necessary funding amount and the new "holding" classification. Prior to July 1, of each new fiscal year, BBMR would send the file of authorized positions to DHR. This would include any new positions that were created with the "holding" classification. The "holding" classification

would be an indicator to both DHR and BBMR that the position cannot be filled. The agency would need to reclassify this position through the normal review process and seek approval by the ECC and BOE. This solution would create the positions in the budget and ensure that yearly position counts are correct for the budget publications.
